

HUNTER REGION MG CAR CLUB CARAVAN TOUR

The car club is proposing a caravan tour in 2015 for those members who have caravans and will not be attending the National Meeting. This is something completely new and we are asking for expressions of interest. During Easter 2015, the township of Corryong in Victoria, on the foothills of The Snowy Mountains, will be hosting The Man From Snowy River Bush Festival over the Easter Long Weekend. This, they have been doing annually for the past few years. Camping is provided on the fairways of the golf course from the Monday before the weekend, until the Monday at the end of the weekend. Adjacent to the golf course is the showground where most of the festivities take place. The golf course is only a ten minute walk from the town centre. There is a host of very interesting activities that members can attend. See wwwbushfestival.com.au.

The costing for the camping is \$50 for the three days from Friday until the Monday or \$100 for the whole week payable as you enter the golf course. A portable shower block and toilet block (on the back of a huge semi-trailer) is provided, however, there is not power or water available for camping on the golf course. Participants are advised to fill their water tanks prior to arriving. There is a costing for entering the showground for the festivities by way of a one, two or three day pass, however, there are other free activities available (e.g. bush poetry etc.) should people not wish to enter the showground. Corryong is a lovely town and worth investigating. It is proposed to leave Newcastle on the Thursday morning before Good Friday and meet that night at a fabulous free camp at Gunning , 1 kilometre off the Hume Highway, where toilets and showers are available as well as a good, cheap pub meal directly across the road. There is a water tap available upon entering the camp at Gunning should members wish to fill their tanks there, rather than before leaving home. I would suggest, however, that tanks be filled before leaving home in case access to the only tap is blocked by parked cars.

After the festival, we would be travelling via Tumut Caravan Park for one night stop on the way home with maybe a stop at a great free camp site (Henry Angel Flat, 650 in Camps 7) before Tumut? Members, of course, can work out their own arrangements for returning home and travelling to Corryong if they wish.

The IT folk who wrote the original registration software have helped change the CAMS Event Entry system to suit our National Meeting requirements and we have decided to use this facility to handle our 2015 registrations. You will see that to do this you will first need to register as a CAMS client, except Social Entrants who can log straight in when we go live on 3rd December. We believe that the instructions for registering provided are adequate and a number of our members have now tested the system. New to CAMS Event Entry? Just watch the two short tutorials, it's easy to get started. For Competition entry, create an account or log in.

If you have special dietary needs make sure you select them under "My Details".

Select "My Cars" then add your car information making sure your car is in the correct MG Class under Motorsport Information.

When your personal and car details are correct you are ready to enter the National Meeting.

At the top, click UPCOMING EVENTS, select MG Car Club National Meeting 2015, then click event details RH side. Click Social Entry (no Log in). Then fill in the required information on the entry form.

Note: you cannot use the same email address for multiple entrants. Each competitor AND social entrant must have a unique email address.

The above entry to the National Meeting will be available after the 3rd of December. However we suggest you enter your information and car details into CAMS Event Entry now, so that when entries open you can click "MG Car Club National Meeting 2015" and all your details will be copied into the entry. Finalise your entry and pay.

While all this was going on, I went to the trouble of having all fasteners, nuts bolts, screws, washers, clips and bracketry, re-plated in a zinc finish, which made every grease covered and grubby part come up just like new.

There is nothing more pleasant when doing a restoration, than in being able to use lovely, bright and shiny, nuts and bolts. I then stripped the seats of their old decrepit covers, grit blasted the frames, repainted them and had them recovered in a new tan, leather look vinyl. At the same time I made all new trim cards (door liners etc) and had them colour matched by the same upholsterer.

I had all the brightwork re-chromed and repainted the black parts, engine, heater box, tappet cover, air cleaners, and all of the original black painted brackets, with a two pack finish. The windscreen frame was stripped and repainted to match the original finish with a silver two pack.

At the same time, I had the engine completely rebuilt, the gearbox and rear axle inspected and made good where necessary, and I had purchased new chrome wire wheels, and all of those new items that couldn't be restored to as new. I had also purchased a new fuel tank, radiator, carpet, a hood, a tonneau cover in a matching tan, and I re-painted the hood frames with a complimentary tan two pack colour, to also compliment the tan steering column, pedals, and whatever.

As I write this, I am waiting on a call to collect my new tan colour, vinyl covered dash. Forgot to mention, that the car has been painted in a "go-faster-red", (non original), and all instruments have been professionally restored. If anyone is curious as to why I am not restoring this MGB to its historic originality, it is because I am doing it for me, and not to bother myself with trophy chasing. Been there done that. In spite of departing from originality, it will be a beautiful MG when finished.


One other aspect of my needing to complete this restoration, is because I have to.As age is creeping up on me, we are planning to downsize to a smaller place and there won't be room for a full sized tractor and slasher, a caravan, two MG's a ride-on mower, a car trailer, a box trailer a boat trailer with boat, and a substantial amount of workshop equipment etc.Sale of at least one concourse quality MGB will be necessary, when we move from here, in approximately twelve months or less.



SU FUEL PUMP REPLACEMENT

With the following advice from the interweb etched into my brain "Recommended procedure before taking on a repair of Lucas equipment: Check the position of the stars, kill a chicken and walk three times clockwise around your car chanting:" Oh mighty Prince of Darkness protect your unworthy servant.."

I then proceeded to replace my ageing electric su pump on my MG which sometimes, I think, is an acronym for More Grief.

The replacement SU Pump was of the generic electronic type which would, according to advice given to me by better mechanical minds than myself, give me more reliable operation and many years of trouble free motoring. The first step was relatively easy with the removal of the offending pump and the replacement with the generic pump. A simple job that took 20 minutes and even shouted the "B" with a new fuel filter in the process.

At the turn of the ignition I heard the familiar tick of the pump putting fuel into the carbs and thought all was well with the world and proceeded to take the "B" for a test drive. That was when the trouble started.

2 Kilometres down the road there was a cough from the motor and all was quiet in the engine bay. Waiting a few minutes and turning on the ignition I again heard the familiar tick of the pump. (must have been a small hickup in the installation process that has righted itself) As my fathers advice, who was not renowned for his mechanical ability, always said "leave it long enough and it will fix itself".

Not wanting to test my luck I turned around and headed back to the garage only to stop again 1/2 a kilometre from home. Maybe I didn't leave it long enough to fix itself.

Eventually the ignition was turned again, and again the pump ticked happily away. I made it back home and proceeded to diagnose the problem with the limited ability of a novice repairer. The first thing I did was start the car and rev it between 4 and 6 thousand revs. This was not a steady incline in revs but what the rev counter was flickering between Another problem not yet solved by leaving it alone and letting the fairies fix it.30 seconds passed and again silence from the engine compartment.

Fuel,in my mind ,was the obvious problem, so I started to browse the interweb for solutions. Many a subject was found, which probably only confused me even more, with so many options to ponder.

<u>Fuel filter:</u>Well it was new but decided to check the correct direction of flow anyway

<u>Fuel flow:</u> disconnected the fuel line before the Carbs and turned the ignition on.A good flow within the tolerances was achieved.

<u>Air sucking in the fuel line:</u> The fuel line before the carbs was immersed in a container of fuel and low and behold there were some bubbles of air going into the container from the fuel line.Replacing the ruber fuel lines would surely solve my problem.**NOT**

Ran the B again at the rev range again and after the B stopped, immediately turned the ignition off, and removed the top covers from the fuel float chamber and they were almost empty.

<u>Fuel floats/needle and seats:</u> Replaced the needle and seats then consulted three wise men plus one (well it is around Xmas)over a few cleansing ales, for advice on the validity of the floats and came up with a resounding conclusion of maybe, couldbe possibly.

The first wise man (Bro'G)as we shall call him, fiddled with the floats a bit and pronounced them O.K.

The second wise man (Bro'L)thinking outside the box suggested that I put a cover over the B so the fairies could do their work in private. The plus one (Bro'M) suggested we have another beer.

One suggestion however proved to validate the needles, seat and floats by using a container and gravity feeding the carbs thus eliminating the entire fuel system up to the carbs. Bro'B, as we shall call him, is indeed a wise sage. The "B" didn't miss a beat or protest the lack of fuel.

Pin hole in the feeder tube inside the tank: Sucked the fuel line from the carb inlet through the system to the tank. There was no hole in the tank from the mouth full of fuel I received. I know that sniffing petrol is illegal but don't know the legalities of swallowing it. With no police in sight I proceeded to the next stage.

<u>Bad fuel:</u>Deciding to drain the tank from the drain plug proved more difficult than expected because of the left hand thread of the drain plug. I know, I know, the drain plug is not a left hand thread but I was under the car and I presume under the influence of petrol fumes (still no police sirens)Changing the fuel had no effect as well, but I can appreciate the dangers of petrol sniffing.

I can hear the deafening roar from all the mechanics out there ELECTRICAL, ELECTRICAL but please remember that I am a novice for this kind of thing, and in retrospect, I am beginning to doubt my fathers advice.

My last ditch effort was to consult the manufacturer who ,in hindsight, should have been consulted in the first place. This was pointed out to me by my better half ('THE HANDBRAKE') her nick name is quite appropriate because she pulls me up before I do something more stupid than normal.

Electrics: By now 'THE HANDBRAKES' chickens were looking in danger of being sacrificed. The manufacturer did direct me to an alternative train of thought. And NO it wasn't walking around the car chanting, although I was seriously considering this as an option at the time.

Ignition off produced nearly 13 volts at the terminal with 12.8 volts with the ignition on. Also with the ignition on I had the same voltage of 12.8 at

the positive terminal on the fuel pump. So far so good.

Now for the starting of the machine to test voltage again. With the rev counter flicking between 4 and 6 thousand revs (I'm beginning to distrust the fairies) the voltage at the battery was 14.1 volts but the voltage at the pump terminal was flickering between 11 and 18 volts. The pump was going out in sympathy with the rev counter.

Bring on the chooks, put on the loggers and lets start chanting.

After consulting someone in the knowledge of electrical thingies, he suggested the "B" had probably been converted to negative earth many moons ago, probably by someone with the same knowledge as yours truely, but the conversion mightn't have involved the changing of the terminals onto the coil, thus leaking the higher voltage through the ignition system, and apparently the higher voltage to the new electronic fuel pump affected the diode inside the pump making it spit the dummy and refuse to work with the motor running.

Going back to my shed I inspected the terminals and found them to be in the right positions.

A white flag was produced at this stage and the "B" was presented to the master of electrical thingies for further investigation.

He tested the voltage at the fuel pump and declared that there was a voltage drop at the pump but could not detect, from his meter, the high voltage that I had detected. Suggesting that my meter was faulty left me perplexed because the 15 year old shop assistant at the Dollar Shop had assured me that, through his vast experience, the \$10 volt meter was of exceptional quality.

The advice, from all this, was to put relay switches on the fuel pump and thermo fan that had been installed previously, to take the strain off the single ignition fuse, trying to provide power to all of the added on bits. A further test after the switches were installed shows a healthy voltage to all and sundry, and an added bonus was that the thermo fan runs at a higher speed. The Tacho still flickers but that will be investigated at a later date (maybe a bad earth)

In conclusion I feel that Lucas Electrics sometimes doesn't deserve such a bad reputation. We, as fans of these little cars, spend many a day tinkering and preening them, updating their systems to keep up with the modern world, taking them out to enjoy them and all coming together to talk about them and their little quirks.

Just sometimes it hits the fan.

As one of the wise men told me once, there are two types of people that own MG'S owners or drivers. The owners that tinker and preen and the drivers that just get in and drive. I am aiming to be an owner but have not had much luck so far.

Any way, the chickens are safe, 'THE HANDBRAKE' is happy the "B" is back on the road, lhave suffered minimal hair loss and a greater appreciation for the dangers of sniffing petrol. "She who must be obeyed" has insisted I take a sabbatical before I proceed with the installation of the new electronic distributor that I have just purchased.




Guide to Fuse Replacement
