The MG Muster was inaugurated fours ago, as a reflection of a sad date in the MGB history, 2nd November 1972. A white MGB was wheeled off the Zetland Sydney production line, the last of 9,000 units built in Australia. There was a black drape covering the bonnet of the car which followed an undertaker walking ahead also dressed in black, a solemn occasion. The head lights were on and the car was followed by past models of MGs all with lights on as part of a funeral procession. Production may have stopped but the car didn't die. There are still thousands around turning the heads of on lookers.

Past MG Musters have all been held in November as recognition to this act in the MG marque history. This year because of calendar complications with car clubs participation in the event, it will be held on Sunday 9th September. Car clubs invited to participate (MG owners only) are from Port Macquarie, Taree, Great Lakes Forster, MG Car Club Hunter Region, MG Club Newcastle and the Sydney MG Car Club. This is a combined participation event with the bulk of the cars coming from Taree, Forster and the Hunter, the numbers will be fewer from the other clubs because of distance.

Sydney have been invited to make a weekend of the event with a visitors' program involving Saturday lunch at Hexham, visit to Fort Scratchley then an overnight stay at Forster. The venue for this year will be the Plough Inn Hotel Bulahdelah for lunch. The car park will be exclusive to MG cars for a public display. Back in the later months of 1988, a group of members rescued a 1954 Morris J Van from the wilds of outer-suburban Sydney. The idea was that the van would make a great vehicle to cart our gear around and what a wonderful advertising tool for our club it has been.

As I've been flicking through some old club magazines I came across a couple of articles which tell some of the story of its rebirth.

On the Marque – March 1989

Those of us who have been closely involved with the re-build in the project's inception have found it to be a rewarding experience. A couple of weeks back the van moved under its own power for the first time in 10 or 15 years! This game and sturdy little workhorse certainly caught the imagination of those present during the test-run afternoon, and quite a queue formed to sample the delights of driving this near vintage commercial vehicle.

All those who have contributed to the van's reconstruction should be congratulated for the continued high standard of workmanship. The finished job, not too many months away, should be a credit as well as an asset to the club. All body repairs are nearing completion, mechanicals checked out, all wiring replaced, brakes totally rebuilt and the preparation for painting has commenced.

An interesting discovery during the paint stripping was the emergence of the familiar dark blue and silver lettering, proof that the old dear was an ex-NRMA Road Service Van.

Cost to the club of rebuilding the van has been kept commendably low through generous donations of goods and services by many Newcastle business houses.

On the Marque - July 1989

For those of us involved in the Club's Morris J Van project, Monday June 11th 1989 was a very satisfying day.

After more than eight months of body preparation including a major steel re-

placement programme, panel beating and filling, the main body section received its first application of paint, comprising etch primer and high density undercoat. The Dulux 'Two Pack' system comprising the use of two reactive components to give a chemical set rather than the time honoured acrylic lacquer technique has been chosen because of its more rapid application and claimed superior finish.

Painting expertise has been largely supplied by Col Bailey and Jeff Redman who have both put in considerable hours over recent weeks overseeing final body preparation prior to painting. The ongoing spate of wet weather has proven to be an annoyance during the body preparation, but thanks to Wayne Routley's excellent garage very little moisture damage has occurred during the body preparation period.

Thanks should also be given to the many volunteers (too numerous to mention) who have assisted with paint stripping and panel preparation. Nearly forty years of accumulated paint build up required a good many Saturday afternoons to remove! Prior to the external painting the interior was prepared and sprayed with ivory enamel, the light colour enhancing one of the main features of the Van, its roominess!


In addition to the body preparation, work is also drawing to completion on the drive train, electrics and braking system allowing the project to move into its final finishing phase with the Van hopefully available to assist with Club activities in the next few months. Many thanks again to our sponsors, particularly Dulux whose products we are now using "by the bucket full".

The last major decision to make concerns the choice of colour. After many long sessions reviewing colour combinations, the final choice appears to be Hornby Green with black mudguards, green wheels with brown and cream signwriting.

We should know in the near future if the above choice has been the right decision. It is also pleasing to learn that the Canberra Centre has also decided to rebuild a Morris J Van as a club service vehicle and we wish them well with their project.

The articles about the J Van were written by Robert Gibson who was the "J Van Co-ordinator".

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


