MGCCHR Clubman Point Scoring System

The Honour Board on the wall in the Clubroom has provision for the yearly Clubman Champion and Sporting Champion.

Every member has the chance to get their name on the board through consistency of participation in Sporting Events or Clubman runs.

Sporting results are kept by the Sporting Director and apply to any MG Club endorsed sporting event that members compete in whether it is a hill climb, motor kana or racetrack event. 1 point allocated for each sporting event a member competes in during the club year. 1st, 2nd and 3rd placings are decided by the total number of points allocated and are rewarded with a trophy. The 1st placing winner's name is listed as the **Sporting Champion** on the Honour Board.

Clubman results are kept by Public Relations Officer (PRO) and are forwarded to him via (A) member responsible for monthly Wednesday mid week pub and club runs, (B) member responsible for monthly Thursday tuning runs, (C) Club Captain responsible for Sunday monthly Clubman runs. To qualify for Clubman points members must participate in a minimum of 3, mixed or the same, event runs in the same MG during the club year (July to June).

Depending on what model MG you own and or participate in will decide 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each allocated model division. PRO allocates one point to each driver and mate for each Clubman run for each MG Division. Trophies are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each MG Division and to the first three MG mates (car partners, wives, girlfriends, boyfriends etc.) The overall winner (the member who participates in the most Clubman runs) wins the Clubman Trophy and has their name listed as the **Clubman Champion** on the Honour Board

Our Club also has a **NON MG** class which is designed to attract members with other marque sports cars to join our club and participate in all runs. PRO allocates one point to each NON MG sports car participating in a run. Members must also participate in a minimum of 3 runs in the same NON MG car to qualify for the trophy. There is only one **NON MG and mate** combined trophy which is awarded to the member with the highest points at the end of the club year.

Although NOT awarded annually the **Octagon Award Trophy** can be awarded by the committee to a NON committee member who in the view of the committee continually assists the MGCCHR with a range of services over the club year.

Concours' are a chance to give your car a thorough clean up. About .1% of people are serious about building a concours car and I know they can be beautiful to behold but, it'd be like owning Phar Lap and keeping him locked in a stable, never allowing him to walk let The concours should always be about rewarding the most original example of each model. I have seen what I consider atrocious judging at times in the past, but none of the judges are professionals. Unfortunately, with 32 different classes, and 2 maybe 3 judges per class, it is always a massive logistical task to get 64 – 96 judges that have some knowledge of different models. You can't judge the class that your MG is in (obviously), even though that is probably the class you know the most about.

If you think that you'd like to have a go at judging but don't think you know enough, there's only one way to learn. 80% of the judging can be done by anyone. You are looking at condition and cleanliness. It's only when you get to originality that you ask lots of questions. You can do this if you are a judge, you can't really as a competitor. It is possible if you ask in the right way, to get some feedback but just looking at the final published results won't tell you exactly why you were marked down in a particular area and how you can improve for next time.

Your club has members that can help when it comes to originality questions. Just remember, we are only doing this as a leisure activity, so don't ask for help then get huffy (technical term) with the answers. You'll get a reputation. Listen and learn.

Anyway, for the majority of us, it's about getting a point for our club and seeing our babies sitting out with lots of other beautiful MGs. A concours trophy is like finding a unicorn for some of us, but you never know what the competition is going to be until the day. Do a good cleaning job inside, outside and underneath and you never know. At the Queensland Nat Meet there were people that had spent multiple tens of thousands of dollars on their paintwork and hours polishing under the guards. The rain was torrential so even the worst paint job looked good and if the judges had laid down to look under the cars they risked drowning. It's a shame I didn't have a roof on the car I'd entered. Wet bummer.

Dinky Toy Ramblings. The Austin Atlantic A90

After my highly successful article in the last "On the Marque" (well the Editor said he liked it) I offered to do a regular feature. So I thought I would next look at the Austin Atlantic A90.

This remarkable car was first exhibited at the Earl's Court Motor Show in London in 1948 and production ran from 1949 to 1952. It was developed for the USA market as in the immediate post war period it was vital for English car manufacturers to export to generate foreign income to help the economy.

Unfortunately for Austin, this was not successful as they had to compete with the Jaguar XK 120 which also appeared at the same motor show and had a much better performance. The A90 was powered by a 4 cylinder inline 2.7litre engine which was subsequently used in the Austin Healy Sports Car and the Austin Champ Jeep. In the US it had to compete with the big American cars which were often fitted with V8 engines. Only around 350 out of a total production run of 8,000 were sold in the USA. Others were exported to Australia and NZ where it was quite popular.

Surprisingly it broke records for its class in the Indianapolis stock car races for its class.

It had a number of novel features. It was produced as a 2 door convertible and sedan. The two stand out features were the central 3rd main beam headlight and a wind down rear window on the sedan. The convertible came with a power top and wind up windows, unheard of in the UK at that time. Unfortunately it was built with many mud traps in the body panels, making it very prone to rust, such that there are now said to be only 60 surviving cars in working order in the UK and about another 100 overseas, one of which we see at our Euromotorfest regularly in Newcastle. The iconic design included flying "A" s on the front wings and cowled in wheel arches.

Dinky manufactured a convertible 1/43 scale from 1954 to 1958, initially numbered 140a and then 106. The first photo shows a light blue and red model original Dinky with a recent black reproduction from Deagostini made in China. The original has a steering wheel and dashboard which is left out in the replica model, though the box illustration shows a steering wheel.







The Base plates are very similar with the main difference being "MADE IN ENGLAND MECCANO LTD" replaced by "MADE IN CHINA DEAGOSTINI MATTEL".

The observant among you will have noted that I paid 25 Pounds for the original (around \$50) in the UK some years ago, the new one in the box was about \$25.

Next month I will discuss some of the other Austins made by Dinky.

ON THE MARQUE

In pursuit of a peppier but quiet, cool MGB GT

As most club members may know, I am in the middle of a major overhaul of my 1976 GT.

As part of this I have been doing a number of things to my car to try and make it quieter and cooler in the cab of the MG.

Firstly as part of the engine upgrade I have put a new exhaust system but I have not fitted extractor's, instead I had the cast iron manifold grit blasted



and ceramic coated to keep the heat in the exhaust system and minimise radiating heat into the engine bay. I also had the carburettors heat shield grit blasted and ceramic coated.

The engine itself is being refreshed, (big valve "O" series head with hardened valve seats fitted, ported and polished, 3 angle valve seats and the engine having cylinders honed and high compression pistons etc) this should give the car a little more pep but also increase the heat from the engine.

Above the muffler, under the passenger floor, I have fitted a ceramic/alloy



shield to reflect the heat of the exhaust away from the interior of the car. I also sprayed deadener on the underneath of the car.

On the interior floor I have fitted "Black Silver" noise/heat matting to increase the comfort level in the cab.

Next is underlay for the carpets to further decrease noise and heat.

When the roof lining is replaced I will be installing heat insulation above the lining.

Hopefully these measures will make the cab a lot more pleasant place to be.
