Around the bend – ravings of your President

Well, we had a sniff of what success is like, unfortunately it didn't last very long. I finally got to a committee meeting and club night where I was thrilled to be able to present the Oceania Nuffield Trophy to the club members and celebrate the huge milestone in the club's history. As I said, unfortunately. There were some points of order in relation to point allocation for a number of perpetual National Meeting trophies and those on the podium were changed.

Originally, when the rules were written, it was a requirement for there to be at least two MG's in a class for them to be counted. This is the way the calculations were done for us to win the Nuffield. At subsequent delegates meetings, a decision was made to drop this requirement for all individual and club trophies like the Golden Gudgeon, Chris Dodds Memorial, Wratten and the Nuffield etc. With a recount and two Queensland MG's only having one car in their class or only entering two not three events (motorkhana and Hillclimb because they were co driving), they have managed to jump us and Newcastle for the top honour.

We had our 15 minutes of fame.

At this year's delegates meeting it was decided that the organising club could combine small classes after the close of registration thus closing the chances of this happening again. We just need to get members to a) enter and b) compete in everything they can. Then we'll have a chance.

Over a beer or two with our Sporting Director, I've even been discussing both the 2023 and the 2024 National Meetings in Adelaide (MGCC SA) and in Goulburn (MGCC NSW). If you are thinking about attending either or both of these, PLEASE let me know. Both of these are just an 'expression of interest' and not a registration or anything. I can then have a think about travel and accommodation planning. It's only 11 months to go, and if you don't start planning now, it will creep up on you without you realising.

Personally, I have already booked accommodation at Tailem Bend Rydges, because there are very limited places available out there. I

can easily cancel. Since we have 2 days out at the bend, probably starting at 7.30am and being 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hrs from Adelaide, I thought it would be best to stay out there and get in now.

June finds me heading south for work with the Firies for a six+ week stint at Perisher Valley Fire Station for the start of the winter season. It's a 24/7 job where we look after fires (yes think about old timber lodges with heaters getting cranked up and left on non-stop) and rescue for the alpine region. I will get qualified on 6x6 qualds, skidoos, and Hagglunds (look it up). It's one of those 'bucket list' things so I'm looking forward to the experience.

As part of the MG Car Clubs of Australia's celebrations of the centenary of our marque, there is a big rally being held next year. It is a Touring Road Rally from Friday 22nd September 2023 to Thursday 28th September 2023. This event will also be open to any MG owner, whether they be a member of one of the fifteen MG Car Clubs around Australia or a non-MG club owner.

It will be a National Hub Rally over sealed roads with starting points in Brisbane, Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide, and Canberra. Over six days, each route would cover some 2,500-3,000km touring SE Australia, conducting non-speed "Special Tests" and "Challenges" enroute. The Special Tests would not be outright speed events, and only used to split "dead heats" in the daily navigation/timed rally route.

The various routes would all combine to finish In Canberra for the final day and celebration dinner/trophy presentation. The Pre-War MG Register of Australia are planning their Bi-annual gathering of Pre-War models in Canberra in October of 2023 – the hub rally would finish the day before the first day of the Pre-War Rally. This will allow the participation of some of the Pre-War owners in the Hub Rally and give the "post-war" MG owners an interesting "after rally" event to enjoy.

The event will be limited to 251 cars – 50 from each starting point. This will keep numbers to a manageable level on each route and the finding of 30 rooms for accommodation in regional/rural towns achievable.

There will also be limits on model numbers (no more than 5 of each from each starting point), so we do not see 250 MGB's and no other MG models. The aim is to encourage the participation of a wide range

of MG models, from Pre-War, through T-Types, MGA's and MGB's through to the last of the British built MG's in 2005.

The entry fees will be high, however it is a Centenary Event that is a one off and not be repeated for another 100 years.

The aim is to make the event affordable and good value for the average MG owner to participate. No special rally equipment will be required, however an accurate and working odometer (or smartphone app) will be essential to follow the prescribed route at the nominated timetable.

DINKY TOY REMINISCENCES AMERICAN BEAUTIES. By John Stuart



Dinky produced a number of American models starting with the Chrysler Airflow (Number 30a, centre of picture) produced in 1934 and followed by the 39 series saloon cars in 1939 which I will detail next month.

The cars I want to discuss today were mostly produced in the 1950s starting with the Cadillac Eldorado (No 131 1956) pink convertible and Pack-

ard Convertible (132 1955) light brown and red. While these cars were not often seen in Britain at the time, they proved popular with Dinky customers. The Chrysler New Yorker (French Dinky 24A yellow and green is another American convertible, strangely not sold in Britain according to my references but has the baseplate inscribed in English, presumably for the American market. The other convertible is the Ford Thunderbird (French no 555 1962) white and red. This model has the turning front wheels and



suspension and was available in Britain with the baseplate in English.

The other saloons I have pictured are the Buick Roadmaster (French no 24V, ?1950) blue and black, Hudson Commodore (171 1950) two tone cream and brown and the very early Chrysler Airflow (30a 1934 to 1948) in the centre. This model had no baseplate and separate grill and bumper attachments.

Of the models shown, only the

Hudson and the Packard are repaints.

The picture (L) shows the Packard which has been superbly professionally restored.

Another view of the Packard with the Chrysler New Yorker which is the only one of the models that I have boxed.

Below is pictured the Buick Roadmaster, Cadillac Eldorado and Hudson Commodore and undersides of the 2 Chryslers showing absence of baseplate in the earlier model.

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

MGCCHR Clubman Point Scoring System

The Honour Board on the wall in the Clubroom has provision for the yearly Clubman Champion and Sporting Champion. Every member has the chance to get their name on the board through consistency of participation in Sporting Events or Clubman runs.

Sporting results are kept by the Sporting Director and apply to any MG Club endorsed sporting event that members compete in whether it is a hill climb, motor kana or racetrack event. 1 point allocated for each sporting event a member competes in during the club year. 1st, 2nd and 3rd placings are decided by the total number of points allocated and are rewarded with a trophy. The 1st placing winner's name is listed as the **Sporting Champion** on the Honour Board.

Clubman results are kept by Public Relations Officer (PRO) and are forwarded to him via (A) member responsible for monthly Wednesday mid week pub and club runs, (B) member responsible for monthly Thursday tuning runs, (C) Club Captain responsible for Sunday monthly Clubman runs. To qualify for Clubman points members must participate in a minimum of 3, mixed or the same, event runs in the same MG during the club year (July to June).

Depending on what model MG you own and or participate in will decide 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each allocated model division. PRO allocates one point to each driver and mate for each Clubman run for each MG Division. Trophies are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each MG Division and to the first three MG mates (car partners, wives, girlfriends, boyfriends etc.) The overall winner (the member who participates in the most Clubman runs) wins the Clubman Trophy and has their name listed as the **Clubman Champion** on the Honour Board

Our Club also has a **NON MG** class which is designed to attract members with other marque sports cars to join our club and participate in all runs. PRO allocates one point to each NON MG sports car participating in a run. Members must also participate in a minimum of 3 runs in the same NON MG car to qualify for the trophy. There is only one **NON MG and mate** combined trophy which is awarded to the member with the highest points at the end of the club year.

Although NOT awarded annually the **Octagon Award Trophy** can be awarded by the committee to a NON committee member who in the view of the committee continually assists the MGCCHR with a range of services over the club year.



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
