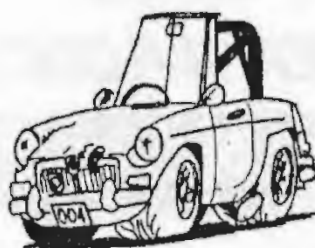

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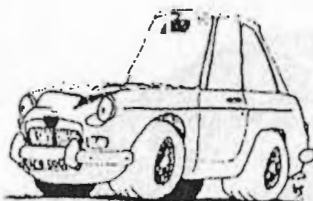

CLUBMAN POINT SCORE SYSTEM

I have been asked to clarify the Clubman Point Score System:-

To summarise it for those that don't want to read the complete version, you don't have to be the best or fastest driver. You don't have to be the most economical driver. You don't have to have a concours, or even a shiny car. Just come along, enjoy a pleasant (I hope) social day, driving your MG along the back roads, an old fashioned picnic, a yarn with your friends (old and new) and if you do it regularly, you just might surprise yourself at the presentation dinner.

Now the complete version:-

The Aim

of the Clubman runs is to promote the driving (use) of MG cars on the road in an enjoyable and non competitive way (ie; not championship, competitive events, gymkhanas, concours, speed events etc).

Frequency

There will be at least one Clubman run a month, if possible, on the third Sunday of each month (can be moved at the Club Captain's discretion if other events clash). The event will be advertised in the club's magazine, On the Marque, and distinguished with a 'hash' sign - (# these events contribute to your Clubman points). The magazine will also contain exact details of date, assembly point and time of commencement.

Trophies

The Lake Macquarie City Council (sponsors of the award) "Clubman of the Year" perpetual trophy will be awarded to the MGCC Hunter Region member who gains the over all maximum total of points (in other words, the person that attends the most events).

The point score will be further split into MG classes, for which a trophy will be awarded. For a car to qualify, a minimum attendance at four events is required.

"MGMate" Trophy awarded in recognition of member who accompanies the MG driver at events.

Conditions and Rules

Members will receive a point for each event completed. Completed means participating from the advertised starting venue and time to its designated finishing position.

Drivers and passengers joining in en-route or at their own convenience will not be eligible for outright or class points in that event.

Drivers with more than one MG may alternate cars without penalty to the Clubman of the Year award and will attract points in the MG class entered for that event (minimum four entries per year, per car, for trophy). Where more than one class has been entered by an MG driver his/her 'outright' point score shall be the sum total of all class points awarded.

To encourage family participation, the rules allow for the events named as "Any Port in a Storm" and the "Christmas Run", that a driver and "mate" can participate in any vehicle but nominate a vehicle of the driver's choice (eg; participate in your Bentley but nominate it as your 1932 F type Magna).

If the MGCC Hunter Region J Van is required at any clubman event, the nominated driver and mate shall not be penalised and can nominate a vehicle of the driver's choice.

If the MG driver is replaced (substituted) for any reason during the course of an event, the substitute driver cannot claim points for the event. Only the driver nominated at the start of the event will attract points.

The Club Captain will at his/her discretion give double points for Clubman of the Year three times (runs) during that year. Double point runs are for Clubman of the Year only.

Drivers and MGs will not be penalised because of lack of participating MGs in that class.

It is the driver's responsibility to completely and accurately identify his vehicle in the attendance book eg; MGB MK1, MG TF 1500, MG BL GT, MGC Roadster etc.

The final word - get the MG out of the garage and I will see you on the next run.

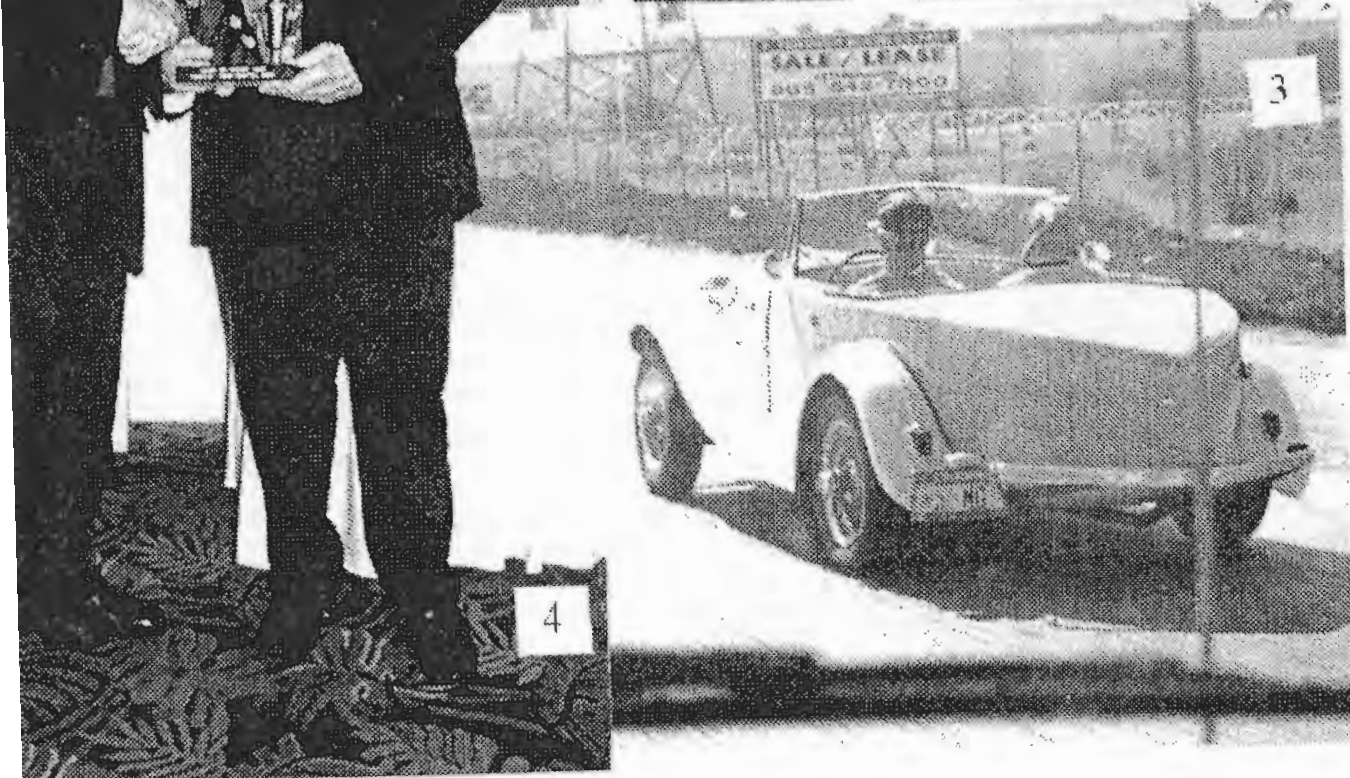

Lola Cars International Ltd, the internationally renowned race car company, will develop an MG that will enter the Le Mans 24 hour race in 2001.

Commenting Nick Stephenson, deputy chairman of Rover Group and a Lola car director said: "We are delighted to have the expertise of the people at Lola, who won at Le Mans this year, working on this exciting project. It demonstrates how serious we are in developing the MG brand which has been underdeveloped previously. The return to international motor racing is a major part of injecting excitement and performance into the brand."

Martin Birrane, executive chairman of Lola said: "This is an historic day in the history of Lola Cars International Ltd. It has been my aim to be involved with a major manufacturer, and to be in partnership with a marque such as MG is an honour. Everyone at Lola is very proud to be associated with such a great British name. Hopefully we can add to the legendary history of the MG name by giving it success at Le Mans."

The Lola SR2 that won the LMP675 class at Le Mans will be on display at Donington Park in Derbyshire this weekend during the FIA Sports Racing World Cup. There will also be three MG invitation races run in conjunction with the MG Car Club.
