Wakefield Park management has recently announced it will close the gates to the racetrack on September 1 claiming that it is no longer a viable business after the Land & Environment Court ruling allowing it to only operate 4 days per month.

It appears that unless the State government intervenes the track will probably stay closed & yet another Motorsport facility will disappear & become just a memory.

You can read a fairly detailed article on the net by Auto Action.

As a result of the closure "HSRCA" has cancelled its "Spring Festival" programmed for the weekend of September 10 & 11 at "Wakefield Park", so that's two Motorsport events that historic Motorsport has lost in the last two months.

The good news for us is that "GEAR" has decided to run a "GEAR day at Sydney Motorsport Park" on Monday October 24 using the Druitt (north circuit) which is 2.8 km long.

They will run the December event at "Pheasant Wood Circuit Marulan" if "Wakefield Park" is still not available.

Steve Jones, Austin Blanch & I have already entered in the "GEAR" event at "SMP". This event should be worth having a look at as there will be some interesting cars competing. Anyone interested in go-



ing down & having a look can contact me for further details.

FOR IOO YEARS

SOME OF THE JOY MAINTAINING MY MGB GT

Some of the Joy's of maintaining my MGB GT.

Like many of us in the club since I bought my MGB GT in May 2021, I have done a lot of work to the car to bring it up to good running order so I can enjoy participating in club events.

Through the past 12 months I have gone through all the mechanical items of my car and doing most of the work myself just like many of our club members.




We would not be able to do this work without the close support of the parts suppliers Australia wide giving us ease of supply of parts for our loved cars and in fact it is easier in many cases to get all the parts for our old MG's than it is for our more modern cars. With suppliers like "Sports Parts", "MG spares", "Abington Spares" and "Retro Road and Track". We not only rely on these suppliers for their support with parts but also their knowledge to help solve problems we have along the way.


Of recent time I fitted my reconditioned motor back into the car. This engine has been modified with a sports cam, high compression pistons, "O" series big valve head which has been ported and polished, then the engine con-rod's, crankshaft, flywheel etc have all been lightened and balanced.


While all these modifications to the engine improve the breathing and speed of acceleration of the engine these improvements present their own set of issues with the auxiliaries and support equipment. One issue in particular was the ignition system, in the form of the distributor.

My 1975 MGB GT has a 45DE4 distributor which has a manifold vacuum advance that means the distributor works opposite to a ported vacuum advance distributor like a 25D distributor from the earlier model MGB engines. On a ported vacuum advance distributor the vacuum is very low at idle and increases as the engine accelerates in rpm whereas the manifold vacuum advance is full vacuum at idle and the vacuum decreases as the engine increases in rpm.

With the sports cam and the engine modification there is an increased rate of acceleration of the engine and the engine suffered from "pinging" (pre ignition) at mid range RPM.

After a lot of experimentation, and disconnection of the vacuum advance, we got the engine to run with only a short rpm period of the pinging issue. Next we graphed the ignition advance over the full range of the engine RPM for both the 25D4 and the 45DE4 distributors thinking the solution might be a resetting of the distributor advance curve.

We then talked to the representative at "Retro Road and Track " whom had supplied a new 45DE4 distributor and supplied them the advance curve information. They put us onto another per-

son whom had extensive experience in "A" series and some experience with "B" series engines who discussed with us the advance curves that we had plotted. He suggested a solution to our specific issue that involved changing the idle advance setting and NOT the advance curve of the distributor. This indeed did solve the pinging issue but he also advised eliminating the manifold vacuum advance.

"Retro Road and Track" are now suppling a modified distributor with mechanical advance only, inline with the information supplied to them from their recommended experienced person.

The people at "Retro Road and Track" could not have been more help in solving this problem.

Thanks to all the suppliers whom have provided parts and advice. Howard White

M.G. Centenary in Australia 1923 - 2023




1968 MGB Mk2 Roadster



MGCCHR Clubman Point Scoring System

The Honour Board on the wall in the Clubroom has provision for the yearly Clubman Champion and Sporting Champion. Every member has the chance to get their name on the board through consistency of participation in Sporting Events or Clubman runs.

Sporting results are kept by the Sporting Director and apply to any MG Club endorsed sporting event that members compete in whether it is a hill climb, motor kana or racetrack event. 1 point allocated for each sporting event a member competes in during the club year. 1st, 2nd and 3rd placings are decided by the total number of points allocated and are rewarded with a trophy. The 1st placing winner's name is listed as the **Sporting Champion** on the Honour Board.

Clubman results are kept by Public Relations Officer (PRO) and are forwarded to him via (A) member responsible for monthly Wednesday mid week pub and club runs, (B) member responsible for monthly Thursday tuning runs, (C) Club Captain responsible for Sunday monthly Clubman runs. To qualify for Clubman points members must participate in a minimum of 3, mixed or the same, event runs in the same MG during the club year (July to June).

Depending on what model MG you own and or participate in will decide 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each allocated model division. PRO allocates one point to each driver and mate for each Clubman run for each MG Division. Trophies are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each MG Division and to the first three MG mates (car partners, wives, girlfriends, boyfriends etc.) The overall winner (the member who participates in the most Clubman runs) wins the Clubman Trophy and has their name listed as the **Clubman Champion** on the Honour Board

Our Club also has a **NON MG** class which is designed to attract members with other marque sports cars to join our club and participate in all runs. PRO allocates one point to each NON MG sports car participating in a run. Members must also participate in a minimum of 3 runs in the same NON MG car to qualify for the trophy. There is only one **NON MG and mate** combined trophy which is awarded to the member with the highest points at the end of the club year.

Although NOT awarded annually the **Octagon Award Trophy** can be awarded by the committee to a NON committee member who in the view of the committee continually assists the MGCCHR with a range of services over the club year.



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
