## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

# Ravings of your President.

-l've been reading some interesting articles (not on Facebook) about alternate fuel vehicles. As a professional that has to deal with them when they catch fire, I can attest to the dangers involved compared to a boring petrol or diesel powered car fire. I have multiple safety bulletins on electric car fires.

The fires are next to impossible to extinguish (they talk about 30-60000 litres of water needed, even better, push the car into a dam), the fumes given off are extremely toxic hydrogen-cyanide, hydrogen-fluoride, hydrogen-chloride, and you could have ongoing secondary fires up to three weeks afterwards. Nice anytime but worse when you are at sea and can't just run away.

February last year, a cargo ship (Felicity Ace) carrying 4000 vehicles (both electric and non-electric including Porsches, Bentleys and Audis) sank in the Atlantic after an electric car caught fire and the fire couldn't be extinguished. It spread through the cargo and ship and despite the best efforts of the crew and fire tugs, it couldn't be saved. With this in mind, a European ferry service has done a risk assessment, and made the decision that it will not allow electric, hybrid and hydrogen vehicles to be transported on any of their vessels due to the dangers.

I understand and agree that the risk is frightening. There is a move to ban charging systems in car parks, garages and under buildings. Yes, these lithium batteries are the same as used for solar battery storage.

Spend a minute thinking about what would happen if the ferry ban spread across the world. This is entirely possible if the insurance companies refuse to cover ships carrying these cars due to the unacceptable dangers to people and ships. The humble trip to Tassie and back??? (Scientific facts supplied upon request).

-It seems that I may have kicked an ant's nest with my article last month. The interesting part is that all the reactions have been that the nest has needed kicking for many years and I should keep doing it. It seems that many members, not just from our club, have the same feelings about concours. A good saying, if you have a complaint, you should provide a solution. With that front of mind, I am drafting a discussion paper to give all concours judges a guide to allocation of points for originality. It will also be handy for members who are looking at their own MGs and wondering a) how to present their car and b) why they got the position they got. There should be a consistent allocation of points.

To start with, I would like to see the name changed from a Concours d'élé-

gance (promoting the prettiest cars) to Concours d'original (promoting originality). For some reason all the MGCC's have always called it the former. I know that at any of our club's concours, there are no more than  $\frac{1}{2}$  dozen people who's MGs are strictly concours cars. The rest of us are there for a nice day out with mates.

Is it worth all the angst for only a couple of people? Well, if we ignore this and let concours continue the way they have been for many years, we'll end up with a dog and pony show where it's all about who can make the prettiest and shiniest cars. No one will have any idea of what they originally were. There are many big time 'motoring journalists' that wouldn't know a great car unless you pay a £1,000,000 for it. The humble little MGs in their bog standard spec have always been brilliant, fun and a value bang for buck.

So please do try and join in, even if you are on your own, don't be shy, because lots of us are single members.


We have the reputation of being a friendly 'social' club, and I'm sure you will finish the day feeling glad that you came along!



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# **VICTORIAN MG CC CONCOURS 2023** Elliot Burns

The Victorian MG Car Club held their annual Concours on 26<sup>th</sup> February at a new venue at Caribbean Gardens, Scoresby in the Dandenong region of Melbourne. The concours is organized to coincide with the British & European Motoring display, sort of like our club holding our Concours & Euro Day at the same time. As a result, the event is enormous & while there is a plethora of stunning MG's to admire (the largest representation of a single make), there are plenty of other beautiful & interesting cars to admire.

I attended for lots of reasons, but mainly to see friend Ian Prior display his MG PA for the first time. Ian & I have a few things in common; we both own green MG YT's & we have both been restoring MG PA's during the covid period. This has meant many emails & questions as we both tried to work out how various bits of our cars went together & also to encourage each other through the ups & downs of a long journey through a restoration.

lan's car, like many early MG's has quite a story to tell. The chassis was the basis of a quite successful club racer in the UK in the 1940's and 50's piloted by Don Moore who later became the engine guru at Lister Jaguar. It was restored in the 60's with a replacement body fitted from another car and somehow ended up in the USA in the 80's. A friend of lan's spied the car advertised on eBay & purchased & imported it from the USA 15 years ago but did virtually nothing to it. Ian bought the car when his friend was having a garage clear out. Although it appeared complete, it was not running & very tired. The last 3 years have been spent stripping many of the major components & trying to rectify 89 years of wear & tear. It must have been a great feeling a couple of months ago to finally start the engine, see healthy oil pressure, not hear any horrible noises & get the PA moving under its own steam for the first time in a long time. There are still things to be done, but the progress to this point is a great achievement.

There were quite a number of Pre-War MG's on display, so I spent hours pouring over some of these cars to get information, ideas & enthusiasm! I think two of these pre-war MG's are worth a special mention. The first was George & Marguerite Morgan's K1 which was the outright winner of the concours. This two-tone green car is quite simply magnificent.

The second pre-war car that caught my attention was a K3 which is a very significant car in MG history. K3002 was a works race car built in March 1933 & entered initially in the Mille Miglia driven by Sir Henry Birkin. It was bought by Lanes Motors of Melbourne & shipped to Australia where its competition career continued immediately in the 1934 Australian Grand Prix. It finished second after starting from the scratch position in the handicap race. The cars competition career continued as it passed through many owners including Ken Tubman (of Redex & Maitland fame) before eventually ending up with the Berryman family in Melbourne who have now been custodians of the car for more than half its life.



# **MGCCHR Clubman Point Scoring System**

The Honour Board on the wall in the Clubroom has provision for the yearly Clubman Champion and Sporting Champion. Every member has the chance to get their name on the board through consistency of participation in Sporting Events or Clubman runs.

**Sporting** results are kept by the Sporting Director and apply to any MG Club endorsed sporting event that members compete in whether it is a hill climb, motor kana or racetrack event. 1 point allocated for each sporting event a member competes in during the club year. 1st, 2nd and 3rd placings are decided by the total number of points allocated and are rewarded with a trophy. The 1st placing winner's name is listed as the **Sporting Champion** on the Honour Board.

**Clubman** results are kept by Public Relations Officer (PRO) and are forwarded to him via (A) member responsible for monthly Wednesday mid week pub and club runs, (B) member responsible for monthly Thursday tuning runs, (C) Club Captain responsible for Sunday monthly Clubman runs. To qualify for Clubman points members must participate in a minimum of 3, mixed or the same, event runs in the same MG during the club year (July to June).

Depending on what model MG you own and or participate in will decide 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each allocated model division. PRO allocates one point to each driver and mate for each Clubman run for each MG Division. Trophies are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each MG Division and to the first three MG mates (car partners, wives, girlfriends, boyfriends etc.) The overall winner (the member who participates in the most Clubman runs) wins the Clubman Trophy and has their name listed as the **Clubman Champion** on the Honour Board

Our Club also has a **NON MG** class which is designed to attract members with other marque sports cars to join our club and participate in all runs. PRO allocates one point to each NON MG sports car participating in a run. Members must also participate in a minimum of 3 runs in the same NON MG car to qualify for the trophy. There is only one **NON MG and mate** combined trophy which is awarded to the member with the highest points at the end of the club year.

Although NOT awarded annually the **Octagon Award Trophy** can be awarded by the committee to a NON committee member who in the view of the committee continually assists the MGCCHR with a range of services over the club year.



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
