I recently attended the Winton Festival of Speed at Winton Raceway in Victoria as a spectator, what a great weekend of Historic Motorsport with a 100 entries competing in 11 divisions & probably another 60 show cars on display on both days. Practice on Friday saw rain & a slippery track with plenty of competitors finishing up in the infield, Saturday & Sunday saw perfect sunny weather prevail.

The feature race for the weekend was the "Just Cars" 50 km "group N Touring Car Cup" which was great spectacle to watch with Mustang's, Camaro's, Falcon GT's, Torana XU1's, Cooper S's, Datsun's, Alfa's & all the great touring cars of the sixties & seventies doing battle.

"Group S" also saw some close racing & as usual Simon Meyer driving his super quick MG midget was up the front of field worrying the hell out of the higher powered Porsche's & Corvette's.

"HQ Holden" racing was also great to watch with cars going through corners 4 wide at times.

"Victorian MG Racing" also had a group of 21 cars of MG & invited British Sports cars competing in their own event. Some of these cars are



extensively modified machines but as I understand it engines & bits used must be of MG origin hence the cars running a V8



engine will have Rover engines in them with some of these producing over 400 hp (that's a serious MG engine).

The group consisted of a wide range of MG models & a few Triumphs thrown in, with some close racing throughout the field.



"Team Hunter" member Bruce Melville competed in the Regularity division in his Alfa 105 & found it hard to get consistent laps in with the speed differential of the competitors.

With vehicles ranging from a T model Ford to a Boss 302 Ford Mustang Bruce's best placing over the weekend was 4th.

That was a great result considering there was a total of 37 competitors.

1980 MG MGB GT LE last of line and last Abingdon MG

From the moment the MGB was introduced in 1962, it was extremely successful, especially in the important North American export market. It enjoyed an 18-year production run, with over 512,880 MGBs built in total of which 125,621 were GT models. Thus it was the best selling British sports car ever.

Power came from the venerable 1.8 litre B-series engine, coupled to a four speed gearbox with overdrive. It is also fitted with the rubber bumpers which replaced the original chrome bumpers in 1974 to satisfy US federal laws.

This particular car, in common with the other 999 cars in the final batch, is a Limited Edition model with special paint work, coachlining and wheels. This example is finished in metallic pewter with cast alloy wheels.

The car came off the assembly line on 22nd October 1980 and was the very last MGB to be produced. It was also the last MG and the last car to be built at MG's Abingdon factory. By the time the factory closed its doors, the MGB had accounted for nearly half of the 1.2 million MG models that had left Abingdon during fifty years of production.

The morning tea stop was at the Tinto café on the foreshore at Toronto where we were met by more club members.










The run from Toronto was to the Beresfield Pie Shop at Ourimbah where we met up with Larry and Shirley Dickason.

STAGE 1: Lambton to Riverside park Raymond Terrace.

- 1/ Head west on Elder Street and turn right onto Morehead Street.
- 2/ At traffic lights turn right onto Newcastle Road.
- 3/ Take Edith Street and Maud Street to turn right into Industrial Drive in Mayfield West
- 4/ Turn left off the Industrial Drive onto Tourle Street across the bridge and follow Cormorant Road across the island .
- 5/ At the roundabout take the first exit to go across "Stockton Bridge" and follow Nelson Bay Road to the Williamstown roundabout and take second exit.
- 6/ At the next two roundabouts take the second exit and continue along "Nelson Bay Road".
- 7/ At the next roundabout take the first exit onto Richardson Road.



MGCCHR Clubman Point Scoring System

The Honour Board on the wall in the Clubroom has provision for the yearly Clubman Champion and Sporting Champion. Every member has the chance to get their name on the board through consistency of participation in Sporting Events or Clubman runs.

Sporting results are kept by the Sporting Director and apply to any MG Club endorsed sporting event that members compete in whether it is a hill climb, motor kana or racetrack event. 1 point allocated for each sporting event a member competes in during the club year. 1st, 2nd and 3rd placings are decided by the total number of points allocated and are rewarded with a trophy. The 1st placing winner's name is listed as the **Sporting Champion** on the Honour Board.

Clubman results are kept by Public Relations Officer (PRO) and are forwarded to him via (A) member responsible for monthly Wednesday mid week pub and club runs, (B) member responsible for monthly Thursday tuning runs, (C) Club Captain responsible for Sunday monthly Clubman runs. To qualify for Clubman points members must participate in a minimum of 3, mixed or the same, event runs in the same MG during the club year (July to June).

Depending on what model MG you own and or participate in will decide 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each allocated model division. PRO allocates one point to each driver and mate for each Clubman run for each MG Division. Trophies are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each MG Division and to the first three MG mates (car partners, wives, girlfriends, boyfriends etc.) The overall winner (the member who participates in the most Clubman runs) wins the Clubman Trophy and has their name listed as the **Clubman Champion** on the Honour Board

Our Club also has a **NON MG** class which is designed to attract members with other marque sports cars to join our club and participate in all runs. PRO allocates one point to each NON MG sports car participating in a run. Members must also participate in a minimum of 3 runs in the same NON MG car to qualify for the trophy. There is only one **NON MG and mate** combined trophy which is awarded to the member with the highest points at the end of the club year.

Although NOT awarded annually the **Octagon Award Trophy** can be awarded by the committee to a NON committee member who in the view of the committee continually assists the MGCCHR with a range of services over the club year.
