### From the Editor

### **Graham Haywood**

This issue of the magazine has reports on our club's monthly activities of Square Riggers, Club Meeting, Midweek Gathering, Club man Run. There is no report on the monthly Tuning Run as the poor weather and damaged roads caused the run to be cancelled.

The club was also represented at the "MG Racing NSW" at SMSP during May and our Sporting Director has reported on the event including tales of woe on vehicle condition after a good start to racing.

Our Club was represented at the "All British Day" run by JDCHR during APRIL and I have included a pictorial report on that event in this issue of our magazine.

### Progress with my MGB.

Following on from my report on brake woes I have checked the front wheel bearing clearances with my dial indicator and magnetic base to find they are both within new clearances of between .01 and .05 mm and the brake discs are rotating without any measurable warp.

The brake pads supplied with the kit of parts did seem to be too thick as I was having difficulty in inserting them between the caliper pistons and the brake disc, especially on the inner driver side. After installing new brake discs it was much easier to fit the pads in place. I measured the new discs thickness and they were 2mm thinner than the old discs hence the relative ease to install the pads.

This questioned my replacing the discs but the easier installation of the pads won out.

The brake pads are Mintex brand and the adjacent photograph illustrates the initial difference of the contact patch between the inner (LH pad for inside drivers side) and the outer pad. However it also indicates that the pads are parallel to the discs suggesting that the pistons are not cocking in their bores.

The end result is that I will cease being too concerned as the brakes work well and the scraping sound is almost gone.

On Saturday May 17 "Team Hunter" members Steve Jones in his MG Midget & Matt Blanch in his father's MGA competed in round 2 of "NSW MG Racing" series at "SMSP Eastern Creek", running with the Mazda MX5 Cup cars. They were a support category for the "Sydney 300 Endurance Race" which was run in the evening. This event is considered to be the premier event of grassroots level endurance Motorsport in NSW.







Considering the recent weather we were fortunate to get a good sunny day after a foggy start to the morning.

In the practice session both Steve's Midget & Matt in the MGA looked to be going well, with Matt mixing it with lighter more nimble "group S" Midgets & Steve having his own race with one of the invited cars, a GSM Dart. Steve eventually getting a fair gap on the Dart.

After a few laps in race 1 Steve's Midget had a bad driveline vibration & some nasty noises at the end of the main straight & was towed back to the pits. After jacking the car up we found the rear universal in the tail shaft had come apart & although not a real serious problem that was the end of Steve's day on the track. At that point in time the "A" was still running well & Matt finished the race with the "Group S" Midgets.





In race 2 we saw Matt in the MGA becoming more of a threat to the "Group S" Midgets dominance & was looking quick.



However after a few laps the "A" cut out & had to be towed back to the pits. A quick check revealed that the engine had locked up cause unknown.

Further investigation will be required but could possibly be a broken crankshaft.

So that was the end of the day for "Team Hunter".

This is what can happen when you push these old cars well past what they were designed to do & I believe that with advances in modern technology some of these cars are going quicker than the factory cars were going back in the old days.

Steve's repair should be a straight forward job but the repair on Austin's "A" will be a bigger Job unfortunately.

I'm hoping to have my "B" up & running for the June "GEAR" event at "One Raceway", also Paul Embleton has a few issues to deal with on his "B" before that event.

Parking was convenient across the road from the entrance.




### JDCHR ALL BRITISH DAY APRIL 2025



### **MGCCHR Clubman Point Scoring System**

The Honour Board on the wall in the Clubroom has provision for the yearly Clubman Champion and Sporting Champion.

Every member has the chance to get their name on the board through consistency of participation in Sporting Events or Clubman runs.

**Sporting** results are kept by the Sporting Director and apply to any MG Club endorsed sporting event that members compete in whether it is a hill climb, motor kana or racetrack event. 1 point allocated for each sporting event a member competes in during the club year.

1st, 2nd and 3rd placings are decided by the total number of points allocated and are rewarded with a trophy. The 1st placing winner's name is listed as the **Sporting Champion** on the Honour Board.

**Clubman** results are kept by Public Relations Officer (PRO) and are forwarded to him via (A) member responsible for monthly Wednesday mid week pub and club runs,

- (B) member responsible for monthly Thursday tuning runs,
- (C) Club Captain responsible for Sunday monthly Clubman runs,
- (D) member responsible for co-ordinating display of MGs at MG Club endorsed Car Shows or Community Events (unless there are limits on the number of cars that can participate).
- (E) member responsible for Thursday monthly Square Riggers lunch.

To qualify for Clubman points members must participate in a minimum of 3, mixed or the same, event runs in the same MG during the club year (July to June).

Depending on what model MG you own and or participate in will decide 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each allocated model division. PRO allocates one point to each driver and mate for each Clubman run for each MG Division. Trophies are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each MG Division and to the first three MG mates (car partners, wives, girlfriends, boyfriends etc.) The overall winner (the member who participates in the most Clubman runs) wins the Clubman Trophy and has their name listed as the **Clubman Champion** on the Honour Board

Our Club also has a **NON MG** class which is designed to attract members with other marque sports cars to join our club and participate in all runs. PRO allocates one point to each NON MG sports car participating in a run. Members must also participate in a minimum of 3 runs in the same NON MG car to qualify for the trophy. There is only one **NON MG and mate** combined trophy which is awarded to the member with the highest points at the end of the club year.

Although NOT awarded annually the **Octagon Award Trophy** can be awarded by the committee to a NON committee member who in the view of the committee continually assists the MGC-CHR with a range of services over the club year.
